

Post Treatment Recovery Information

Surgical Post Instructions

After local anaesthesis, your lips tongue cheeks will be numb, so be careful not to here your lip or eath and drink things that may be too hot. Do not rinue your mouth until 24 hours after the extraction. Following this rines mouth gently every 3 to 4 hours (especially after meals) using warm salt water (1-2 teaspoon of sait to a glass of veram water). Continue rinsing for several days. Bleeding

Following extractions some bleeding is to be expected. It is normal for the saliva to be slightly streaked with blood or tea stained for 1t 2 days. If persistent bleeding occurs, place moist gauze pads over bleeding area and bite down firmly for 30 minutes (repeat if necessary). If bleeding still persists, please contact your dentist.

Swelling

Some swelling is normal and should not cause alarm. Swelling around the mouth, checks, eyes and sides of the face is not uncommon. Many times the swelling will not become apparent until 2-3 days post-operatively. An ice bag or ice cubes wrapped in a towel should be applied to the operated area for 30 minutes on and 30 minutes off, repeat this for 4 to 5 hours.

Pain

For mild to average pain use any non-aspirin type of medication. Non-steroid anti-inflammatories like lbuprofen are recommended. Pain or discomfort following surgery is usually at its worst 24-48 hours after surgery, after that should subside more and more every day. If pain persists or worsens you should contact our practice or if after working hours call Nhs24 111 for further instructions.

Numbness

It is usual to experience some numbness following an extraction or placement of an implant. This is particularly the case if you have had a wisdom tooth extractions. Most numbness will subside within 3-4 hours. In some instances it can last longer, if this occurs please be assured it is likely to be temporary. In these cases it advised to contact the surgery for advice.

Diet

Liquid or soft diet is advisable during the first 24 hours. Drink lots of fluids. Avoid drinking with straws for the first few days as this can result in bleeding and delayed healing. The sucking action creates a negative pressure which will cause bleeding.

Sutures

Sutures are placed in the area of surgery to minimize post operating bleeding and to help healing. Sometimes the sutures disintegrate early or disloding, this is no cause for alarm. The sutures will dissolve to be removed approximately 1-2 was sutures will dissolve to be removed approximately 1-2 was present part of the property. The removal of sutures requires no anesthesia or needles. There will be a hole or opening where the took was removed, in the coming months the cavity will gradually fill in with new tissue. In the meantime should be kept clean.

General Advice

Small sharp bone fragments may work up through the gums during healing. These are not roots; if this causes any concern, please return to the practice to see your dentist. It is advised that you use your toothbrush as normal to keep your gums clean.

Are you a smoker?

If you smoke, it is advised that you do not smoke for the first 36 hours. Smoking will delay healing and can cause a very uncomfortable condition known as "dry socket." A dry socket is when the blood clot gets dislodged prematurely from the tooth socket. Symptoms of pain at the surgical site to the ear may occure 2-7 days following surgery. Call the practice if this occurs.
